DUBLIN, Irish Republic, Jan. 6. (Reuter's Service) Several British newspapermen who had been reporting the visit of Princess Margaret to the Irish Republic were recalled by their offices today following a complaint by Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother about their activities.

The British Queen Mother complained to British and Irish newspaper owners that her daughter had been "besieged by the Press" and appealed for the withdrawal of the interpolation of the inter the journalists and the pho-

tographers.
Today's disclosure of the Queen Mother's protest—through her Press Secretary to Britain's Newspaper Proprietors Association and to the Dublin Newspaper Managers Committee — came six days after the arrival of the Royal Party in the Republic to stay with the family of Mr. Anthony Armstrong - Jones Princess Margaret's husband.

Irish Police had been given special instructions to protect the Princess from possible de-monstrations by extreme Na-tionalists or members of the outlawed Irish Republican Army.

Instead, a tired Special Branch police officer who has been with the Royal Party since last Saturday said to-day: "Whatever may have been the main purpose of our round-the-clock security vigil at the outset, it has now developed into ensuring that we
